LGBTQ People with Developmental Disabilities Need Respect, Privacy, and Access to Community



Elliot Page, 'Juno' star, shares transgender identity

Earlier this month, Oscar Nominee Elliot Page; star of many popular films such as "Juno" and "X-Men" shared that they are transgender and identify as non-binary. (Non-Binary is a term used to describe a person whose gender identity is neither man nor woman). Page indicated that they were "inspired" by the trans community and thanked them for "working to make the world a more inclusive and compassionate place." This topic is particularly relevant within our Riverview School community as we have students exploring their own gender identity. We hope to continue supporting our Riverview community with equal amounts of compassion and inclusivity.

GLOSSARY

Terms to build our community vocabulary.

Sex A medically constructed categorization based on the appearance of genitalia in ultrasounds and/or at birth.

Gender The cultural/societal associations to biological sex including expectations of feelings, behaviors, and appearance.

Gender Identity A sense of oneself in the category of gender that may, or may not, correspond to the assigned sex/gender at birth.

Transgender A gender identity in which a person's internal knowledge of gender is different than the cultural or societal expectations of their gender/sex assigned at birth. This includes mtf (male to female), ftm (female to male), and non-binary.

Gender Dysphoria The feelings of discomfort or distress that are induced by one's gender identity not aligning with the gender assigned at birth or the gender-normative standards of the society.

Non-Binary A gender identity that embraces a full spectrum of self-expression that resonate with the individual beyond the male/female binary.
